

TECHNICAL, CREATIVE, AND BUSINESS ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS APPLICATION OVERVIEW

Students serving in technical, creative, and business roles may apply to be considered for an award to recognize their contributions to their school musical productions.

WHAT AREAS OR ROLES CAN APPLY?

Students whose work or contributions fit in any of the following areas may submit a portfolio to be considered for a technical, creative, or business achievement award:

Please note: students serving in assistant capacities may also be considered.

WHAT DO I NEED TO DO TO BE CONSIDERED FOR AN AWARD?

There are two components to be considered for a technical, creative, or business achievement award.

Step One: Submit a Portfolio

Applying students will submit a self-created, digital portfolio in support of their work on the production. Portfolio deadlines are on a rolling basis based on production dates. Those deadlines are as follows:

- Productions in September through November – Portfolios due by December 3, 2018
- Productions in December through March – Portfolios due by April 8, 2019
- Productions in April through May – Portfolios due by May 6, 2019

Portfolio Requirements:

1. 1-2 page personal essay about his or her experience with the production.
2. Supplemental artifacts that demonstrate the student's work on the production. Possible artifacts include scans of renderings, sketches, prompt book, crew or shift lists, lighting plots, videos* and photos. Multiple artifacts are encouraged.

Create one Word or PDF document that includes your digital artifacts. Include your name, school and production title in the top left of your artifact document.

*Videos are to be submitted via Vimeo or YouTube with the link provided in the artifact document. If the video is longer than 5 minutes, indicate the start time; the panelists will only review up to 5 minutes per artifact.



Step Two: Interview with Adjudicator Panel

A brief phone interview will be scheduled between a panel of adjudicators and the student after the portfolio is received. This is an opportunity for the adjudicators to ask clarifying questions after reviewing the portfolio and for the applicant to provide additional insight into his or her process.

Interviews are scheduled on a rolling basis based on production dates. Interview dates are as follows:

- Productions in September through November – Interviews scheduled December 11-12, 2018
- Productions in December through March – Interviews scheduled April 10, 2019
- Productions in April through May – Interviews scheduled May 8-9, 2019

Adjudicators will be asked to review the applicant's portfolio and phone interview based on a rubric.

APPLICATION PROCESS

NEW All portfolios must be submitted digitally this year.

2. As part of the form, you will be required to upload an electronic version of your personal essay and your artifact document.
3. As part of the information form, you will also indicate your availability for your phone interview with the adjudicator panel. Assigned interview times will be communicated to students shortly after the portfolio submission deadline.

**NEW* Technical, Creative and Business Achievement Portfolio Submission Limit*

Please note that beginning in the 2018-2019 school year, each school may only submit up to FIVE portfolios to be considered for a Technical, Creative and Business Achievement Award. The first five portfolio submissions from any one school will be the five portfolios reviewed. Any additional portfolios submitted will not be reviewed or considered for an award.
